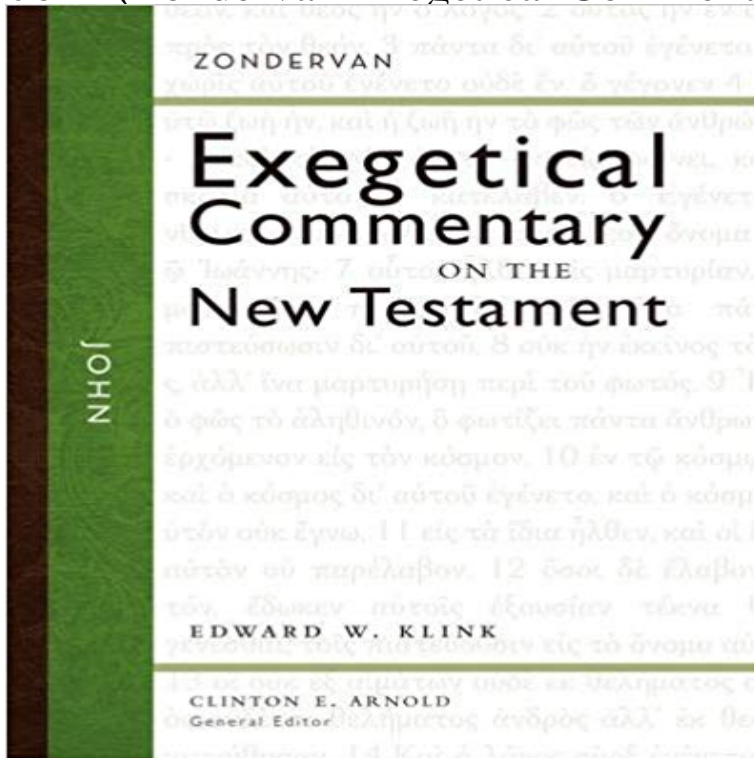


# John (Zondervan Exegetical Commentary on the New Testament)
