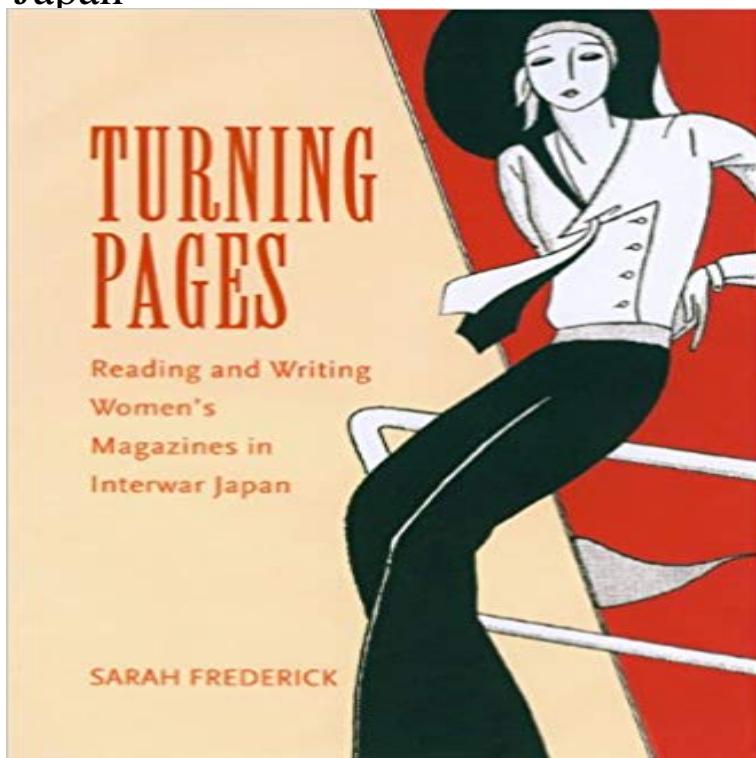


# Turning Pages: Reading and Writing Womens Magazines in Interwar Japan
